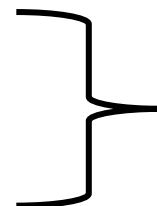

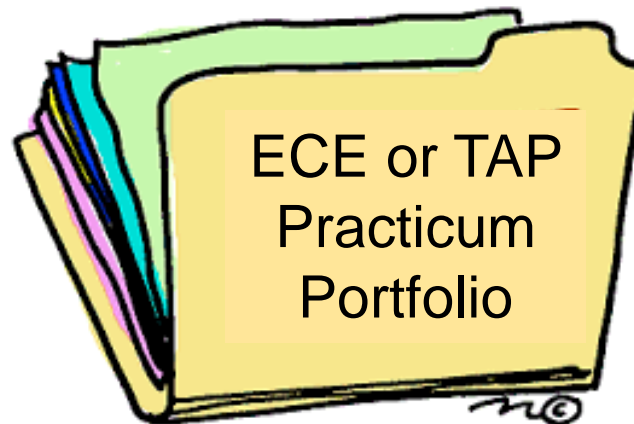

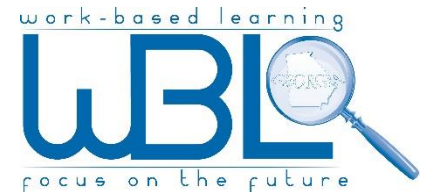
What is a Practicum??

- Internship in a Classroom with Students
 - Early Childhood Education --- 3rd Grade and Below
 - Teaching as a Profession --- All Grade Levels
- Portfolio is Created using the ECE or TAP Standards



Background Check Requirements are needed for the following:

- Early Childhood Education (ECE) pathway
- Teaching as a Profession (TAP) pathway
- Work-Based Learning (WBL) program
- Youth Apprenticeship Program (YAP)



This ONLY applies to students interning in a:

- Licensed child care learning center (preschool or daycare) from DECAL
 - *Further explanation regarding preschools is on the next slide*
- OR license-exempt child care program that receives CAPS (Child Care and Parents Services) subsidy
- It does NOT apply to students interning in a facility that is not licensed by Bright from the Start such as an elementary school setting.
